# NO FOSTER CARE OR WELFARE SYSTEM

Mexico currently does not have the social programs that we have in the U.S. The only way to care and support children in need is through a network of private orphanages, funded entirely through individual and corporate donations.

# **WHO WE ARE**

Corazon de Vida (CDV) is a US for purpose organization founded in 1994, providing life-changing support for orphaned and abandoned children in Baja, Mexico by funding local orphanages, providing quality of life improvement services and investing in the children's future by funding higher education.





### **OUR PROGRAMS**

How do we break the vicious cycle of poverty from perpetuating child abandonment?

By funding orphanages that provide life-saving services and a nurturing environment for abandoned children. Funding projects that increase the quality of life for the children. Funding education and providing opportunities for a life of purpose and possibility!

#### SUSTAIN

This program's focus is on sustaining life. We provide regular monthly funding to each orphanage to cover food, shelter, water and utilities. Funds are transferred monthly through a debit-card system connected to our bank account in the U.S. This system ensures accountability and helps us in responding quickly to specific needs.

### **IMPROVE**

We partner with individuals, groups, clubs, churches and organizations to provide project based funding to improve the children's quality of life. Projects include construction, facilities improvements and repairs, as well as support to improve the overall wellbeing of the children such as medical, dental and psychological needs.

### **EDUCATE**

Support for primary and secondary education includes funding for uniforms, backpacks, transportation costs and graduation costs. Our continuing education program provides scholarship based funding for teens aging out of the orphanage system and it includes funding for inscriptions, tuitions, housing, living expenses and transportation, all depending on each student's situation.

"This is an organization that really makes a difference. Very low overhead so you know almost every dollar you donate goes to the cause. The orphanages in Mexico are all private homes that get no government support, yet the government sets the standards for care and has the right to shut them down. Without Corazon de Vida, these kids would have no where to go."

### **ACCOMPLISHMENTS**

### A NEW DORM FOR THE GIRLS: Rancho de Los Niños takes in 22 displaced girls

We had an emergency situation: A Valle de Guadalupe orphanage that we had been supporting, shut its doors, leaving 22 teenage girls without a home. Very few orphanages accept children older than 12, so finding a place that could take all 22 girls was a big challenge. The alternative was not good - the girls, who had lived together as sisters for most of their lives, would have been separated and sent to rehab centers in various cities around Baja.

We asked Rancho de los Niños (formerly Casa de Paz) an orphanage located about 90 minutes from the San Diego border, to take in the 22 displaced girls. Rancho de los Niños is run by Jorge and Ely Fonseca, who were both raised in the orphanage. When Jorge and Ely took over this failing orphanage two years ago, there were 45 abandoned and abused children living there. Since then, Jorge and Ely have been able to grow their "family," and they have been providing a safe, loving environment for 65 children, and they agreed to receive the girls into their home.

An old, dilapidated building was remodeled to provide a loving home for 22 teen girls. New mattresses, bedding sets, furniture and colorful walls were the perfect setting to welcome the girls to their new space.

We had many individuals and groups working together to make this project possible. Another beautiful example of what we can accomplish when we work together to provide the children the posibility of a better future!

### CHANGING THE ODDS FOR OUR KIDS:

### Continuing education for kids aging out of the CDV supported orphanages

Supporting continuing education for teens aging out of the orphanage system is an important program, as it provides them with the opportunity to create a better future for themselves, their families and their community.

There are currently over 50 students enrolled in either trade school or college who are in the Corazon de Vida Continuing Education program. These students are receiving assistance for tuition, housing, transportation, and living expenses. CDV provides further assistance to students through English courses to supplement their education, and to increase their chances of success in the professional world.

Of the six students that have graduated from our program, four graduated in 2016! Each student has had their own unique struggles, conquering various obstacles through their own willpower and determination. These are just a few stories from the first wave of graduates supported by CDV's Continuing Education program.



Statistics show that each day, 38,493 orphans age out of the system by age 18 worldwide.

Studies show that 60% of the girls become prostitutes and 70% of the boys become hardened criminals.

Another study that tracked 15,000 orphans who had aged out of state-run institutions and found that:

- 10% committed suicide
- 5,000 were unemployed
- 6,000 were homeless
- 3,000 were in prison within 3 years

ISAAC MARTINEZ Accounting

He pursued accounting/finance because of the job opportunities that would be available to him. He says that his degree will allow him to help his family and others so that he might make a difference in his community.



KARLA CAMPUZANO Marketing

Karla and her younger sister were taken from their home and placed at a CDV supported orphanage where they lived for 8 years. Karla, understanding the value of education in her own life, has just completed the Marketing program at UABC Tijuana. Her dream is to become a business owner, having the means to support her family while also being able to give back to her community.



JAQUELINE RODRIGUEZ Nursing

Jaqueline grew up in an orphanage in Maneadero. She entered our program after she had already completed her first two years of UABC nursing school with the support of a local family that was not able to continue their support. With CDV's financial and moral support, she has been able to graduate with a degree in nursing and will soon start her one-year of service.



CECILIA CARMONA Psychology



After high school, Ceci entered the UABC Ensenada campus, working hard to obtain her degree while working just as hard to support herself.
